# Science and Language Centre





## Planning application submitted

Citywise Education has submitted a planning application for a new, innovative Climate, Science and Language Centre adjoining its existing building in Jobstown. Programmes on climate action, sustainable development, general science and biologics will be targeted at second and third level students from the west Tallaght area, opening up new and exciting employment opportunities for them. Citywise will also continue to provide support programmes for local schools.

Citywise Education has had a lasting and transformative impact on young people in west Tallaght through its innovative approach to addressing educational inequality. Building on the success of its current programmes, this new development will allow Citywise to increase its present capacity by over 60%. The project is expected to involve an investment of €5 million over the next three years including substantial support from the corporate sector and trust funds. Construction is expected to commence in autumn 2022 with programmes up and running by summer 2023.

#### Primary -Third Level

With this expansion, it will allow for the development of FTA into third level, meaning support for students right throughout their education.

#### Scale

This project will mean that we can increase the number of students taking part in our after school programmes from **500 to 800** and reach over **2000** students across **20** local schools

## What is Involved?

The project involves the construction of a new Science and Language Centre alongside the existing Citywise Education Centre in Jobstown, Tallaght, on a site provided by the local authority, South Dublin County Council. A new multi-sports playing area will also be constructed to the east of the current building which will be available for public use.

Catering primarily for senior students (16-23), the new building will allow for a substantial increase in services - preparing local young people for college, supporting them while in college and providing top-class career advice and supports to access 21st century jobs.

The additional space will complement the work already being carried out in Jobstown and will enable a 60% increase in programme activity and outreach locally.



It will also facilitate additional leadership training and dedicated career support activities for young people.

#### This will mean:

- Growth in regular provision from 500 to 800 young people
- 2000 students across 20 local schools involved in programmes
- Partnerships developed with 4 third-level colleges
- Greater career guidance and opportunities in the STEM, biologics and languages
- Partnerships with Ireland's top corporate employers

### THE BACKGROUND

Citywise Education in Jobstown, Tallaght grew out of Citywise, a not-for-profit organisation which began in Dublin's inner city in 1991 as a response to the educational under-achievement of young people living in hostile city conditions. Now over 500 local Tallaght young people, aged from 8 to 18 years, ranging from alienated youth to young people with third level aspirations, attend Citywise Education's Character building, education and sporting programmes each week. A multiple of that number engage in programmes hosted by Citywise Education for fifteen local schools.
